"Now, the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increases, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord"

Romans 5:20-21

As the nation of Haiti falls deeper and deeper into crisis, one may ask for a reason any organization would be willing to perform any work in Haiti. However, in this passage, Paul teaches us that as trespasses increase, God's grace becomes more. His grace cannot be overwhelmed by our sins. Therefore, if God in His loving kindness can overwhelm us with his grace as we sin, who are we to turn away from a nation where the sinful nature of man is on full display? We have an obligation to practice the same grace which has been afforded to us to others, especially those living in darkness.

Over the last few years, Haiti has spiraled out of control. The nation has become a lawless nation where gang and political violence are mainstream, resulting in economic, physical, and social hardships for the people. The people of God are not exempt from such hardships. For example, the church in Butte Boyer had to close its doors for several months due to gang violence surrounding the community they serve. Gangs have taken control of the main petroleum hub in Por-au-Prince, which has led to fuel, water, and food shortages across the nation, impacting all five churches supported by Bread of the World Commission. Nevertheless, God's people have remained vigilant in their faith walk, understanding that the struggles they face are only temporary. The church doors in the towns outside of Port-au-Prince have remained opened, but our brothers and sisters are struggling to put food on the table due to unemployment and inflation.
